The Community Wellness Worker works in partnership with the Mental Health Counselors and Clinical Supervisor, to provide effective mental health and addiction services to the community. The incumbent works in partnerships with other government and non-government organizations.

- <u>Listening, Understanding and Responding</u> (Listens responsibly): demonstrate objective and active listening. This includes an ability to behave in a helpful and responsive manner and an ability to seek out the facts and pertinent information before drawing conclusions;
- <u>Client Service Orientation</u> (Addresses underlying needs): seek information about the real, underlying needs of the client, beyond those expressed initially, and match these to available services;
- <u>Teamwork and Cooperation</u> (Cooperates): participate willingly and support team decisions (i.e., good team member/player). This includes doing one's own share of the work and sharing all relevant and useful information;
- <u>Expertise</u> (Answers/questions): answer questions as an expert when asked. This includes telling people about current understanding of technical issues.

The knowledge, skills and abilities required for this position are typically attained by a Bachelor's Degree or Diploma in Psychology (or a related field) together with one year of relevant experience in a scope of practice or experience solely restricted to addictions and mental health. Supervised work experience is also required.
